Positive Discipline Guide: Pupils

What is Positive Discipline?

This is the system by which you will know what is expected of your behaviour and conduct in and around school. It is the way you will receive recognition and praise for all of your positive contributions to your lessons and to the school. It is one of the ways we will be able to tell you that you have done well and the way we can reward your successes.

Why do we have Positive Discipline in our school?

It is important that our school community is a safe environment for everyone to come together to learn. By ensuring we all have the same rules to follow and the same ways of being rewarded, this will help make our school a 'special place to learn and succeed'.

What are our expectations in the classroom?

There are three school rules:

- Be kind
- Be safe
- Be the best you can be

What do you need to do?

You need to make sure that you bring your pupil planner to school each day. This is where you will collect your reward stamps and where, if necessary, staff will write any warnings that need to be given.

You need to make sure that your behaviour, conduct and effort in and around school meets the 3 rules. These will be displayed in your classrooms to remind you of them during the day.

What can you earn Reward Stamps for?

Your teacher will give you reward stamps for a whole range of things, from displaying kindness to each other, being a valuable and positive member of your class, and contributing to the learning taking place. They can also give you reward stamps for excellent pieces of work, to recognise an individual achievement, or for attendance and participation in clubs and school events.
